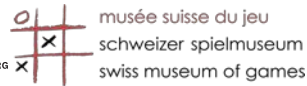

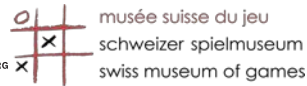

The Tomb of a Prince in Poprad (Slovakia)

In 2006, a tomb of a 4th century German prince was discovered in Poprad, Slovakia. Among the various objects found in the tomb was an almost entire wooden game board, with 6 Roman counters. This discovery is exceptional for the history of the game.
